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I. Scientific Carbon Reduction Targets

1. Great Wall Power Supply Technology Co., LTD is committed to progressively achieving dual control and reduction of both greenhouse gas emissions volume and intensity through actions such as equipment upgrades, raw material substitution, and supply chain optimization. We actively comply with customer and regulatory requirements while fulfilling our social responsibility for carbon reduction.

2. Establishment of Science-Based Carbon Targets In June 2021, Great Wall Power established science-based emissions reduction targets. The company committed to a 5% reduction by 2030, using 2021 data as the baseline. This Science-Based Targets initiative aligns with current global best practices.

II. Great Wall Power's Responsible Raw Material Procurement Policy for September 2025

Great Wall Power expects our supply chain to responsibly source raw materials, with particular emphasis on avoiding direct or indirect funding of conflict sources. This includes

conflict minerals from the Democratic Republic of Congo and other high-risk regions worldwide. Great Wall Power has implemented the following programs and actions in this area to mitigate risks.

- Strengthen due diligence to ensure responsible sourcing in all regions and high-risk areas, publicly report on efforts made, and require suppliers to do the same.
- Utilize the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for responsible sourcing from conflict and high-risk areas, and encourage our suppliers to also adopt this guidance.
- Promote peaceful and stable economic development through collaboration with all key stakeholders, government agencies, industry organizations, and other relevant bodies (such as the London Bullion Market Association, Responsible Jewellery Council, International Tin Association, public procurement sectors, etc.).
- Encourage responsible and sustainable mineral trade and eliminate boycotts against nations and regions.
- Continue to actively participate in the Responsible Minerals Initiative and working groups under the Responsible Business Alliance.

- Use the RBA Conflict Minerals Reporting Template and Responsible Minerals Audit Protocol to ensure the minerals we use are sourced from industry-accepted origins. Additionally, utilize the cobalt reporting template developed by RMI.

- Maintain direct engagement and communication with smelters and refiners, encouraging their participation in industry audits.

Furthermore, according to contractual agreements, Great Wall Power requires suppliers to:

- Comply with all environmental laws and restrictions on materials/minerals.
- Implement the RBA Code of Conduct, including due diligence on conflict minerals, conduct independent audits with RBA-approved third-party auditors, and report corrective actions to ensure compliance.
- Require upstream suppliers to adhere to the RBA Code of Conduct.
- Establish policies to ensure no direct or indirect support for financial crimes and human rights violations.
- Conduct due diligence on the sourcing and monitoring of conflict minerals and publicly report the findings.

Great Wall Power complies with all legal requirements related to responsible global sourcing. We are committed to procuring only conflict-free minerals and exclusively using minerals from smelters that have been audited and verified by RMAP or similar programs. Great Wall Power expects both itself and its suppliers to refrain from sourcing conflict minerals and to further develop responsible mineral procurement initiatives.

III. 2024 Responsible Raw Material Procurement Report

1. Commitment to Responsible Sourcing of Conflict Minerals

The mining of rare metals such as cassiterite, wolframite, coltan, iron ore, and gold in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and its neighboring regions has led to severe human rights and environmental issues. Much of this mining activity is linked to (or funds) armed conflict groups, contributing to long-term instability in the area. As a result, these minerals are referred to as "conflict minerals."

Great Wall Power Supply Technology Co., LTD is committed to responsibly sourcing mineral raw materials such as tin, gold, tantalum, tungsten, cobalt, palladium, nickel, silver, and mica. We strictly adhere to

the Responsible Minerals Assurance Process (RMAP), the Responsible Critical Mineral Initiative (RCI), and the Responsible Business Alliance (RBA) Code of Conduct. We do not support, accept, or use metals sourced from armed conflicts, illegal mining, or substandard working conditions.

2. Due Diligence Standards for Conflict Minerals Sourcing

The company has established the "Supplier Restricted Substances Control Specification" and the "Conflict Minerals Control Procedure," which are communicated to suppliers. We require suppliers not to procure conflict minerals, encourage them to develop policies, implement responsible mineral due diligence, and actively share due diligence information with customers to jointly promote sustainable development. During supplier onboarding, we conduct evaluations and require suppliers to sign the "Declaration of Non-Use of Conflict Minerals" and complete RMI_CMRT and RMI_EMRT due diligence.

3. Conflict-Free Minerals Disclosure

Based on a reasonable country of origin inquiry (RCOI) as well as integrity and diligence, Great Wall Power Supply has reason to believe that the conflict minerals originated from the Democratic Republic of the Congo or its adjoining countries. Therefore, we have conducted due

diligence on the source and chain of custody of conflict minerals in our products and created a Conflict Minerals Report (CMR, EMRT) in accordance with required elements. Indeed, the reported and verified smelters have achieved 100% conflict-free minerals.

4.Actions Taken

In 2024, we will further strengthen our management of conflict minerals by conducting annual due diligence on suppliers through RMT_CMRT and RMI_EMRT. Each month, the responsible department in our company checks the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) website for the list of smelters and refiners to ensure the accuracy of RMT_CMRT and RMI_EMRT due diligence information, confirming that the involved smelters are all included in third-party certified lists such as RMI. We encourage suppliers to choose smelters and refiners audited by the Responsible Minerals Assurance Process (RMAP) and involve them in the RMI working groups. Additionally, we are establishing stronger connections and further automating the supplier conflict minerals reporting template data.

5.Conflict Minerals Investigation

A supplier survey was conducted in the first half of 2024, primarily covering materials containing conflict minerals such as hardware structural components, transformers, inductors, capacitors, resistors, wires, PCBs, and semiconductors. Suppliers were required to provide accurate information, which was then compared with the RMI compliant list and customer requirements to identify conflict-free smelters.

6. Due Diligence on Cobalt and Mica

The mining of cobalt involves child labor and other human rights violations in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. We have conducted due diligence on cobalt minerals used in our materials and expect suppliers to participate in our cobalt due diligence process.

The mica supply chain heavily relies on manual and small-scale extraction and artisanal processing. Child labor, illegal operations, and unsafe health and working conditions are prevalent in mica production and processing.

In 2024, we also conduct due diligence on cobalt and mica to ensure that the smelters used for these materials are on the qualified list.

Company Position and Policy Statement

Great Wall Power Supply Technology Co., Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the Company" or "Great Wall Power") solemnly declares that we firmly oppose and are committed to eliminating all forms of human trafficking, slavery, forced labor, contract labor, child labor, and other forms of human exploitation. We firmly believe that everyone has the right to work and live in an environment of freedom, safety, respect, and dignity.

This statement reflects the Company's commitment to the "United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights," core conventions of the International Labor Organization (ILO), and other applicable laws and regulations. We require all our business activities and partners in the global supply chain to strictly adhere to this commitment.

Company Organizational Structure and Business Scope

The Company is an enterprise dedicated to the research, development, production, and sales of switching power supplies. It is the manufacturer of China's first computer power supply, with products covering server power supplies, desktop power supplies, communication power supplies, industrial power supplies, modular power supplies, OBC power supplies, medical power supplies, and etc. Among these, the Company holds the leading market share in server power supplies in the domestic market and ranks first in the DIY market for PC power supplies. With six R&D centers located in Shenzhen, Nanjing, Beijing, Hangzhou, Shanghai, and Taiyuan, the Company's products are exported to regions and countries including Europe, America, Japan, and South Korea. We recognize that in the globalized business environment, complex supply chains may conceal various risks, and therefore, we remain vigilant at all times.

Due Diligence and Risk Management

To fulfill the commitments outlined in this statement, our company has implemented and continues to refine a set of due diligence procedures addressing risks related to human trafficking and forced labor:

Risk Assessment: We regularly evaluate key areas within our operations

and supply chain that may pose risks related to modern slavery. The Great Wall Power direct management department conducts self-audits, while the company's internal audit department performs independent audits.

Supplier Onboarding and Review: We incorporate the relevant requirements of this statement into supplier contract terms. New suppliers undergo qualification reviews during onboarding, and we conduct random inspections or third-party audits on existing suppliers to ensure their compliance.

Remedial Mechanism: We have established a public reporting channel (see below) to encourage both internal and external individuals to report any concerns or violations. Upon discovering any infringements, we will promptly take remedial actions and collaborate with relevant parties to resolve the issue. For suppliers involved in serious violations, we will terminate the partnership and report them to law enforcement authorities.

Specific Implementation Actions

To ensure the effective implementation of this policy, we have taken the following concrete steps:

Code of Professional Ethics: The company's "Employee Code of

Professional Ethics" requires employees to act ethically, including adhering to the principles of openness, fairness, and impartiality in handling work matters, complying with national laws and regulations, company rules and policies, and other social ethics. Employees must not disclose company secrets nor promote confidential information from other companies.

Focus on Employee Benefits: Providing a safe and healthy working environment is at the core of our company's operational principles. The company equips employees with safe and functional products and equipment, while focusing on implementing and improving processes and controls to prevent work-related accidents, injuries, and illnesses.

Commitment to Diversity and Non-Discrimination: The company's policy, the "Anti-Discrimination Control Procedure," stipulates that there shall be no discrimination in the allocation of work, benefits, or subsidies based on factors such as race, color, gender, ethnicity, nationality, religion, age, disability, sexual orientation, citizenship, political views, social status, marital status, or social or racial background.

Recruitment Practices: All recruitment activities of our company adhere to the principles of voluntariness, legality, and fairness. We prohibit charging recruitment fees to employees or job applicants and ensure that

all employees are voluntarily employed, possess valid identification documents, and fully understand the terms of their employment contracts.

Working Environment: We are committed to providing all employees with a safe and healthy working environment, safeguarding their legitimate rights and interests, including but not limited to the right to resign freely, the right to free movement, and the right to fair compensation (ensuring wages are not lower than the legally mandated minimum standard and are paid on time).

Policy Document: We have incorporated our commitment against forced labor into the "Prohibition of Forced Labor Control Procedure" and require all employees and business partners to be aware of and comply with it.

Training and Awareness Enhancement:

The company regularly provides training for management, human resources, procurement teams, and employees in high-risk positions to enhance their awareness and ability to identify and prevent human trafficking and forced labor, ensuring they understand and fulfill the responsibilities outlined in this policy.

Commitment and Continuous Improvement:

The senior management of this company (including the Board of Directors) fully supports this statement and is committed to providing the necessary resources for its effective implementation. We recognize that eliminating modern slavery is an ongoing effort, and therefore we will conduct an annual review of this statement and its implementation effectiveness, continuously seeking opportunities for improvement to enhance our ability to address this global challenge.
